OBSERVATIONAL RESEARCH REGISTRY

Our ongoing study examining health effects of cannabis use.



FEMALE VETERAN STUDY

Female veterans are underrepresented in cannabis research, so we're giving them a voice in this prospective study examining health outcomes of cannabis use.



FUNCTIONAL MUSHROOM STUDY

We're collaborating with other nonprofits, Unlimited Sciences & Lily's Lighthouse, to start the conversation on the therapeutic potential of Reishi & Lion's Mane mushrooms for those with epilepsy in this retrospective study.

LONG-TERM CBD USE STUDY

We're addressing the need for data on naturalistic CBD use behaviors, dosing, and health outcomes in this retrospective study for long-term users.

THE CANNABIS & HEALTH RESEARCH INITIATIVE

RoC is collaborating with experts at Johns Hopkins University to examine the patient-level impact of therapeutic cannabis use through data collection and dissemination.
